## CONTEST RULES

Please read all rules carefully.

- Contest is open to Elementary, Middle and High School Students, grades 3-12 in Guam's Public and Private Schools in 3 categories.
  - Category 1: 3<sup>rd</sup> -5<sup>th</sup> Grade
  - Category 2: 6<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> Grade
  - Category 3: 9<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup> Grade
- The winner in each category will receive a \$300 Cash
- All artwork must pertain to the theme "*A Legacy of Peace and Friendship 1944-2019 75th Guam Liberation*".
- Entries must be two-dimensional artwork, horizontal layout created on plain white paper, 12"x18" (in.).
- Entries must be original artwork.
- Artwork can be rendered in a variety of media such as colored pens and pencils, crayons, markers, charcoal, pastel, watercolor, acrylic, tempera and oil.
- Digital art and photography are not allowed.
- Only one entry allowed per student
- Student's full name, age, school name, teacher's name and contact information should be written on the back side of the artwork. To prevent judge bias, artwork **MUST NOT** be signed on the front.
- Maximum number of entries allowed per school: 5
- All entries be submitted via the schools to the Guam Council on the Arts and Humanities (CAHA) located at the Angela Flores Building – 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor, 243 Martyr Street in Hagåtña.
- **Deadline** for submission of school entries to CAHA is 4:00 p.m., Friday, May 10, 2019

Note: All entries become the property of the 75<sup>th</sup> Guam Liberation Committee.
